It has been a while since our last update letter, but that isn't because there hasn't been anything to write about. We would love to go through life feeling one mountain top experience after another. In reality, most of our time is spent in the valley. That is where we live and learn and grow most of the time. Sometimes the valleys seem mundane (like homeschooling for 15 years) and sometimes they are really hard (like a week in the hospital). The best thing about time in the valley is that God is there too! He never leaves you and if you are looking for Him you will absolutely know His love and comforting presence.

Camp has been working through a winter retreat season and also getting ready for a busy summer. Our guests this winter made the best of our lack of snow-related activities as we provided them with some creative alternatives. Summer camp registrations came in fast and furious for the first month and have now leveled off. Almost all of our weeks are full and have waiting lists.






This photo on the left was taken on Christmas Day while the kids were trying out their new sled. It was difficult to sled this winter, but life is still fun with this bunch around!
