MINISTRY UPDATE | SPRING 2026

WINTER

Hey there! Thanks for sticking with me and praying for the work here at Lake Lundgren. The last couple months have been busy, but in a good way. Winter at Camp always has a steady lineup of retreats and guest groups, and this year was no different – Men’s, Women’s, and Couples Retreats, along with 10 Guest Groups and several more events. There was a lot going on, but the Lord gave strength for each week, and I was able to preach, teach, and connect with campers and guests in ways that felt genuinely helpful. Now that winter events have wrapped up, we’re turning our focus toward summer planning and a few spring events. But before that, here are some of the main highlights from the past couple of months.

CAMP HIGHLIGHTS

Winterfest (our teen snow camp) focused on Biblical Identity. Our team taught on:

- *Imago Dei (Image of God)*
- *Adoption*
- *Dead to Sin, Alive to Christ*
- *Ambassadors*

I had the privilege of preaching the Dead to Sin, Alive to Christ session from Romans 6. I walked through how our union with Christ means we’ve actually died to sin and been raised to new life with Him. I think the teens responded well to it, but I actually got more positive feedback from our college-aged counselors that were volunteering.



I also taught a breakout session called “**Judge Not!**” on what the Bible actually says about judgementalism. A lot of teens today are unsure how to respond when people around them live contrary to Scripture. They need clarity on how to agree with God about sin, hold to the truth, and yet avoid stepping into God’s unique role as Judge. We spent about 45 minutes walking through Matthew 7:1-6, letting Scripture shape our thinking. I think it was a helpful discussion, and it seemed to give the clarity many were looking for.

Men's Retreats

These two weekends were awesome. Games and tournaments (like cornhole), singing, preaching, deep conversations, and of course a lot of great food. We even had pulled pork tacos **as a snack!** I ran a new stage game/mixer called Mouse Trap Jenga— getting guys to stack live mousetraps into a tower until everything inevitably explodes. An immediate crowd favorite.

What stood out most, though, were the real conversations with men walking through tough situations — church conflicts, wayward kids, health issues, and more. It was so encouraging to see the gospel applied in real time, both to them and to us. These retreats gave us plenty of opportunities to point each other back to Christ.

90th Reunion

On February 20, LLBC celebrated its 90th Anniversary Reunion, and over 400 people attended. The venue was filled with former campers, staff, and long-time ministry partners — all with a shared history at camp. People spent the evening visiting, remembering past summers and retreats, and reflecting on how God used those times to change lives. It was a meaningful milestone and a great reminder of God's faithfulness over nine decades of ministry.

CHURCH HIGHLIGHTS

Men's Conference

At the end of January, my church hosted a men's conference. I'm so glad that I was able to attend this year. From the first note of the first song, it was clear that the Lord was working in a unique way. As over 300 men raised their voices in worship and listened to the truth of the Word being preached, the Holy Spirit was very clearly moving in my own heart as well as others'. The men in our church have referred back to truths learned on that day so many times since. It was an incredible blessing to be a part of.

Discipleship Class

Since the fall I've also been part of a Wednesday night discipleship class. We do pre-work during the week, then come together for teaching and small-group discussion. My small group has stayed pretty consistent all year, and we've really enjoyed our conversations. Together we've grown in our ability to articulate the story of Scripture — the gospel from Genesis to Revelation.
